

THREE WEEKS YOUTH EMPOWERMRNT (SKILLS ACQUISITION) PROGRAM

Introduction

In 2019, EPDI conducted first Empowerment/Skills Acquisition program for female young adults in which about thirteen persons participated fully and were equipped in different skills.

The program couldn't hold last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown.

EPDI put this package together to equip young females with knowledge and skills for positive development.

This year's program held from August 2-20, 2021 at MEPOL Primary and Secondary School, 3/5, Odozi Street, Ojodu/Berger, Lagos

Theme: "Equip for Excellence"

Objectives:

- Empower participants with Entrepreneurial skills for self-employment
- Engage them in meaningful activities and thereby keep them from harmful behaviours due to idleness
- Imbibe good character that will help them stand the test of time through life transforming talks/discussions
- Equip them with knowledge and skills to become Peace Educators/Ambassadors to their peers and others

This year over thirty teenagers, including males, participated in the three weeks program, with about ten participating all through the three weeks of the program. This is due to the fact that some youths are more interested in certain skills, for example, we had the highest number of participants in the second week of the training.

 - Healthy Lifestyle
 - Developing Savings Habit
