With more than 9,000 people losing their lives due to the rapid spread of COVID-19, many



b. Role of NGOs in the promotion of culture & development



d. Experience of Sarwadaya Sewa Ashram (old age home in Lamjung) on fundraising






5. Prof. Dr. Tatwa Pd. Timsina presentation on GARA conference and Deaf Blind Association
